HUNTER DERBIES:

Only one horse/rider combination may compete in each derby. Riders may not enter more than one derby, but horses may be shown in up to two derbies (maximum of two derbies per horse) with different riders. Management reserves the right to limit the total number of entries in the derbies as well as handy round callback.

35. **\$1,250 MIPR 18" Hunter Derby**: Open to amateur and junior short/long stirrup riders at this show and who have entered in at least two other classes at this show. It will be a two round hunter derby over fences. Payout schedule: \$225, \$200, \$175, \$150, \$130, \$100, \$75, \$50, \$40, \$40, \$40, \$25.

<u>Round One</u>: Competitors must jump a course at 18" with a maximum of 12 fences. Course may include option fences, bending line, and unrelated distance. Judged on hunter style, quality, soundness, movement, and brilliance of pace.

<u>Round Two</u>: **Sponsored by Diamond Hill.** Top 4 riders will return in reverse order to jump a handy hunter round which will include at least two of the following: trot jump, tight turn option, halt and/or back, hand gallop a fence. Judged on style, soundness, handiness, and brilliance.

44. **\$1250 Port Harbor Marine 2' Hunter Derby:** Open to Amateurs and Juniors who have not jumped over 2' at this show and who have entered in at least two other classes at this show. It will be a two round hunter derby over fences. Payout schedule: \$225, \$200, \$175, \$150, \$130, \$100, \$75, \$50, \$40, \$40, \$40, \$25.

<u>Round One</u>: Competitors must jump a course at 2' with a maximum of 12 fences. Course may include option fences, bending line, and unrelated distance. Judged on hunter style, quality, soundness, movement, and brilliance of pace.

<u>Round Two</u>: **Sponsored by My Cleaning Essentials.** Top 4 riders will return in reverse order to jump a handy hunter round which will include at least two of the following: trot jump, tight turn option, halt and/or back, hand gallop a fence. Judged on style, soundness, handiness, and brilliance.

36. **\$1,500 American National/Farm Family 2'3" Hunter Derby**: Open to Amateurs and Juniors who have not jumped over 2'3" at this show and who have entered in at least two other classes at this show. It will be a two round hunter derby over fences. Payout schedule: \$375, \$225, \$200, \$150, \$130, \$125, \$90, \$60, \$50, \$40, \$30, \$25.

<u>Round One</u>: Competitors must jump a course at 2'3" with a maximum of 12 fences. Course may include option fences, bending line, and unrelated distance. Judged on hunter style, quality, soundness, movement, and brilliance of pace.

<u>Round Two</u>: **Sponsored by the Foster Agency.** Top 4 riders will return in reverse order to jump a handy hunter round which will include at least two of the following: trot jump, tight turn option, halt and/or back, hand gallop a fence. Judged on style, soundness, handiness, and brilliance.

37. **\$2,500 Copious Solutions and Mason "Noah" Dixon 2'6" Hunter Derby**: Open to everyone including 2'6" Juniors and Professionals. The horse must have been entered in at least two other classes at this show. It will be a two round hunter derby over fences. Payout schedule: \$500, \$400, \$300, \$200, \$200, \$150, \$150, \$150, \$150, \$150, \$75, \$75.

NEHC rated "AA"

<u>Round One</u>: Competitors must jump a course at 2'6" with a maximum of 12 fences. Course may include option fences, in and out, bending line, and unrelated distance. Judged on hunter style, quality, soundness, movement, and brilliance of pace.

<u>Round Two</u>: Top 4 riders will return in reverse order to jump a handy hunter round which will include at least two of the following: trot jump, tight turn option, halt and/or back, hand gallop a fence. Judged on style, soundness, handiness, and brilliance.

A VICTORY CANTER WILL BE ALLOWED AT MANAGER'S DISCRETION. PLEASE, NO JUMPING!

38. **Blue Seal Feeds \$500 Hunter Futurity:** Open to horses/ponies aged 4-7 as of January 1st (age documentation presented with entry blank must be supported by one of the following: breed organization papers, Coggins, or letter from a licensed veterinarian). Judged using the first-round trip of the Derby of the corresponding height that the horse competes at. Pinned 1st-8th. Payout schedule: \$125, \$100, \$75, \$75, \$50, \$25, \$25. Awards will be presented after the pinning of the 2'6" Derby with horses in hand, no victory gallop. Must have entered and shown in one Derby as well as two other O/F classes at the show. Ties will be broken at the discretion of show management.

39. **DMF and Rosie Thompson Team Challenge**: Open to any junior rider and horse/pony combination walk trot pole level and up. Fences not to exceed 2'3". Teams will coach themselves without any assistance. Riders will be allowed to walk the course prior to the class. The score of each team with the lowest score dropped will determine the placing. Limited to 6 teams made up of 4 riders, chosen by a lottery draw of all who enter. A rider from each level will make up each team. Each rider will ride at their level. The captain will assist all of the riders on their team. Teams will be posted no later than class #14 (Special Children's Equitation) on Friday and posted on the course board. A team meeting will be held during class #27 on Friday. All team members must attend. No substitutions will be made unless by management. Meeting will be held behind announcer's booth.

40. **Downeast Medal Finals Pro/Am**: The Professional Amateur class consists of a professional and an amateur on the same horse, each riding one direction. Saddle changes are allowed. Professionals will be asked to show at least one of the following:

Working trot rising, as well as showing a lengthening of stride; the working canter, and the working canter showing a lengthening of stride. Judges may require any additional tests. To be judged on rider's position, seat, and the correctness & effect of the aids.

41. **Sunset Flowerland NEHC Pleasure Class**: Open to NEHC members and non-members. Open to all horses ordinarily used for pleasure purposes with no limitations as to the status of rider or place of residence. To be shown at a walk, trot, and canter. Will be required to back. Loose rein on command of judge only, but without loss of contact. Shall be judged on manners, performance, and quality in that order. NEHC rated "C"

42/43. Copious Solutions and Absorbine Horsemanship Challenge:

This class seeks to identify those of our junior riders who are well-rounded horse people. These individuals not only ride well but also demonstrate a great understanding of and commitment to quality horse care. The class will be divided into two sections by rider's age: 12 and under and 13-17. The class will follow a three-part format starting with a written exam for both groups. **Questions for the written horsemanship exam for each age group will be based on material found in DMF Newsletter articles and the USHJA Horsemanship Quiz Challenge Study Guide.**

Awards for this class will be calculated by adding a rider's score for the written test to their score for their open equitation class on Friday and a practical exam. Based on written test and open equitation class scores ONLY THE TOP SIX RIDERS FROM EACH AGE GROUP will be called back for the practical exam. Payout schedule per age group: \$80, \$75, \$60, \$50, \$40, \$40.

DMF Awards:

EquiFit High Point Maine Rider Award: Awarded to the rider, from Maine, who accumulates the most number of points in all of their classes throughout the show.

CWD Best Horse Award: Awarded to the overall best horse, chosen by the judges.

Antares Best Maine Horse Award: Awarded to the overall best horse, from Maine, chosen by the judges. **Polly MacMullen Memorial Sportsmanship Award:** Awarded to anyone at the show who exhibits kindness, generosity, team spirit, dedication to their peers, a caring attitude, and a love for the Downeast Medal Finals.

Downeast Walk-Trot Poles Medal

- 1st Round All contestants will trot a course of 6-8 poles. The class will be scored numerically and scores will be announced after each round.
- 2nd Round A maximum of four riders, if available, will compete over a shortened course with additional testing to be decided by the judge. The scores from Rounds 1 & 2 will be combined and announced.

Downeast Short Stirrup Medal (12 & under)

- 1st Round All contestants will jump a course of fences 18" in height. The class will be scored numerically and scores will be announced after each round. Well executed simple changes will be accepted.
- 2nd Round A maximum of four riders, if available, will compete over a shortened course with additional testing to be decided by the judge. The scores from Rounds 1 & 2 will be combined and announced.

Downeast Long Stirrup Medal (13-adult)

- 1st Round All contestants will jump a course of fences 18" in height. The class will be scored numerically and scores will be announced after each round. Well executed simple changes will be accepted.
- 2nd Round A maximum of four riders, if available, will compete over a shortened course with additional testing to be decided by the judge. The scores from Rounds 1 & 2 will be combined and announced.

Downeast Mini Medal

- 1st Round All contestants will jump a course of fences 2' in height. The class will be scored numerically and scores will be announced after each round.
- 2nd Round A maximum of four riders, if available, will compete over a shortened course with additional testing to be decided by the judge. The scores from rounds 1 and 2 will be combined and announced.

Downeast Modified Junior Medal

- 1st Round All contestants will jump a course of fences 2'3" in height. The class will be scored numerically and scores will be announced after each round.
- 2nd Round A maximum of four riders, if available, will compete over a shortened course with additional testing to be decided by the judge. The scores from Rounds 1 & 2 will be combined and announced.

Downeast Junior Medal

- 1st Round All contestants will jump a course of fences 2'6" in height. The class will be scored numerically and scores will be announced after each round.
- 2nd Round A maximum of four riders, if available, will compete over a shortened course with additional testing to be decided by the judge. The scores from Rounds 1 & 2 will be combined and announced.

Downeast Modified Adult Medal

- 1st Round All contestants will jump a course of fences 2'3" in height. The class will be scored numerically and scores will be announced after each round.
- 2nd Round A maximum of four riders, if available will compete over a shortened course with additional testing to be decided by the judge. The scores from Rounds 1 & 2 will be combined and announced.

Downeast Amateur Adult Medal

- 1st Round All contestants will jump a course of fences 2'6" in height. The class will be scored numerically and scores will be announced after each round.
- 2nd Round A maximum of four riders, if available will compete over a shortened course with additional testing to be decided by the judge. The scores from Rounds 1 & 2 will be combined and announced.

Please mail as directed on the entry blank. Entries must be postmarked by closing date.

All entries will be processed as received. Please allow 1 week.

Processed entries will appear on Horseshowing.com

All camper reservations need to be received by closing of entries.

Entry blanks must be completed with all classes, all warmups, all addresses/emails/phone numbers for each rider/horse pair before a number will be issued, no exceptions! Entries must be filled out completely to be accepted.

There will be no email entries accepted.

Scratches must be completed before 4:30 PM the previous day.

<u>Early Move-In</u>: We will be allowing early move-in on Wednesday (with extra stall fee). Early movein horses must arrive between 3pm and 6pm on Wednesday, no exceptions. All other horses may arrive starting Thursday 7am. Please notify Jess at <u>kokofoxhorse@yahoo.com</u> no later than 9/6/2024. Written approval must be presented at check in.

<u>Hay/shavings/mats</u>: Please be sure to place all hay/shavings/mat orders in to McCarthy Enterprises (207-431-3160), allowing ample time for them to deliver to your stalls. There will be no payment options on the showgrounds.

<u>Scratches:</u> All scratches must be accompanied by a vet's certificate or a letter from a medical doctor. Stall fees will not be refunded.

ALL DOWNEAST RULES CAN BE FOUND ON THE DOWNEAST WEBSITE

EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT NEHC RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.

All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the show management whose decision shall be final.

Every horse entered for competition will comply with the rules of the horse show management, but management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold this horse show and the officials and employees of the show blameless for any loss or accident to his horse, employees, equipment, which may occur from sickness, fire or otherwise.

The management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit entries and cancel award prizes without claims for damages; to cancel or combine unfilled classes, or to reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or rotate judges.

Exhibitors are notified that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the judges or officials, on the part of the owner, manager, rider, or groom shall disqualify the horse, and the owner shall forfeit his entry fee and other fees.

Show management reserves to itself the power to prohibit any person from attending or showing a horse in the ring and to remove any groom or horse from the show without being liable for compensation.

In accordance with the 1989 Federal Waste Tracking Act, which restricts the disposal of medical waste, bio-hazardous medical waste containers will be provided in the stable area. All exhibitors and their agents are responsible for the proper disposal of this waste.

No person will be allowed in the show ring during the time of judging except the exhibitor and those having official or requested duties to perform.

It is the tradition of the show that riders be correctly attired for the class in question, that attendants be neatly dressed and the horses properly presented. Management may in its discretion bar any person from entering the ring if not suitably presented to appear before an audience.

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Rule 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

Every entry at a recognized show shall constitute an agreement and affirmation that the person making it, along with the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver, rider, and the horse: (1) shall be subject to the Constitution and rules of the Association and the local rules of the show; (2) that every horse, rider, and/or driver is eligible as entered;(3) that the owner and any of his representatives are bound by the Constitution and Rules of the NEHC and the show will accept as final the decision of the hearing committee on any question arising under said rules and agree to hold the show, the NEHC, their officials, directors and employees harmless for any action taken; (4) that the owner, rider/driver and any of their agents or representatives agree to hold the NEHC, the show, and their officials, directors, employees and agents harmless for any injury or loss suffered during or in connection with the show, whether or not such injury or loss resulted, directly or indirectly, from the negligent acts or omissions of said officials, directors, employees or agents of the NEHC or show. Management reserves the right to decline or refuse any entry without being liable for compensation, and eliminate from further competition any exhibitor or horse should the best interest of the show be served. Every exhibitor or his agent and trainer must sign an entry blank.
